#### **Reflection for Pentecost Sunday**

During a brief ceremony in front of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica this weekend, Pope Francis handed a document "Spes Non Confundit" (Hope does not disappoint) to the entire Church, which specifies that the holy year will open at the Vatican Dec. 24 this year and close Jan. 6, 2026, the feast of Epiphany. Pope Francis also asked bishops around the world to inaugurate the Holy Year in their dioceses Dec. 29 this year and celebrate the conclusion of the Jubilee locally Dec. 28, 2025. Jubilee like Pentecost invite everyone to an intense experience of the love of God that awakens in hearts the sure hope of salvation in Christ.

The feast of Pentecost has its origin in the Jewish Feast of Weeks (Ex 34:22), which was celebrated 50 days after the Passover (Deut 16:10). It was the feast of harvest (Ex 23:16) marking the end of the wheat harvest. When the Temple in Jerusalem was built, the feast of Pentecost was transformed into a pilgrimage feast to celebrate God's covenant with them in the giving of the law at Sinai. The Jews believed that the ten commandments were given to Moses 50 days after the Passover. Consequently, Pentecost was observed as a national holiday which brought the Jews together from all part the world. Like the Americans do on thanksgiving, the Jews come together on Pentecost to offer sacrifices and thank God for all his blessings.

The first reading this weekend retells the experience of the early Christians during the celebration of Pentecost. There is the outpouring of the Spirit amid the rush of wind, tongues of fire and the ability to speak in different tongues. God's spirit is contagious, adaptive, charismatic, and unifying.

Tom and Alice were young and deeply in love. They had been married for four years and their friends had given up on waiting for their love to fade. These two had the ability to keep their love fresh and alive. They were easy at showing affection in public, and many people would point to them as an example of a couple who knew how to maintain romance in their relationship. Then tragedy struck. Alice suffered a severe stroke that paralyzed half of her body. She was confined to a wheelchair. Tom became the primary care giver. The two struggled to continue loving each other in these new circumstances. One day as Tom entered the room, he found Alice crying. "I'm so discouraged," she said. "How can I be a partner with you when I am in this condition? I can't love you like I did in the past. Even the simplest things are taken from me. When you enter the room, I want to smile, but I can't do it. Only a part of my mouth turns upward, whereas the paralyzed part remains a crooked little frown." Tom thought for a moment and then knelt in front of his wife's wheelchair. He carefully twisted his own mouth until it mirrored hers. Then he gently kissed her. "See," he said, "We still fit."

It is this kind of love that we celebrate on Pentecost. God give us His Spirit to unleash the power of his love in the world. It is God's Spirit that allows the effects of the resurrection to match our circumstances.

The Spirit of God is flexible and can adjust to our personal conditions. It reshapes herself to meet the circumstances of our lives and makes us agents of God's love in our broken world.

As evident of God's presence, the gifts of the Holy Spirit are expressed in the life of each Christian as: joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control (Gal 5:22).


