FROM THE PASTOR...

Reflection for the Sixteenth Sunday of the Year—B

One day, a little girl is sitting and watching her mother do the dishes at the kitchen sink. She suddenly notices that her mother has several strands of white hair sticking out in contrast to her brunette hair. She looks at her mother and inquisitively asks: "Why are some of your hairs white, Mum?" Her mother replied: "Well, every time that you do something wrong and make me cry or unhappy, one of my hairs turns white." The little girl thought about this revelation for a while and then asked: "Mumma, how come all of grandma's hairs are white?"

The history of salvation as found in the Bible narrates the grand mission of God to bring humanity to know him, love him, serve him, and be with him in eternity. However, we also read in the Bible how privileged people (Kings, prophets, and priests) in history have claimed exclusive access to God and His authority and try to debar others in many ways of having easy access to God.

In the first reading this weekend, Jeremiah uses the image of "shepherd" to refer to the kings of Judah who abused and scattered the people committed to their care by God. On the contrary, Jeremiah looks forward to when there will be a caring and compassionate shepherd in Israel raised up by God to care for His people. The new Shepherd (Messiah) will have a fourfold mission: to unite the scattered children of Israel, cleanse the temple, fight and, of course, defeat Israel's enemies, and finally, reign as King of all the world. Although Jeremiah was referring to a King who will restore the kingdoms of Israel, the true shepherd—King will rule with honesty and integrity. Christians naturally see this shepherd—King as realized in Christ, who definitively brings God's people into a new unity.

In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus and His apostles spend an incredible time teaching the people that they had no time to eat. Consequently, Jesus takes pity on the crowd because according to Him, "they were like sheep without a shepherd." The meeting of the people's hunger and he outstretched hands of Jesus creates the possibilities for miracles of grace.

Thus, Jesus teaches the crowd and shows them the love of God. In our world today, people are searching for teachers of the faith. They seek to learn more about God and hunger for support and direction —these may be people who are angry and confused because they have lost confidence in the Church. These, too, are like sheep without a shepherd. Therefore, Jesus invites all Christians today to be persons of compassion who deeply feel the suffering and the anguish of the people around us. There can be no true Christianity without the virtue of compassion.

<u>Upcoming Collection for Mission: Diocese of Cuddapah, India</u>

Father_Michaelsami preaches next weekend July 27th and 28th the missions appeals on behalf of his Diocese of Cuddapah, India. The proceeds from this special collection will build an extension of a small village parish church, Our Lady of Fatima Church, Koduru, South India, where he was the Parish priest prior to his assignment in our Diocese of Belleville in August 2021. This small church is presently about 585 square feet serving the Catholics from 15 families, those who are embracing our faith and "those of good will and God fearers" who come to the church from the local town of 100,000 people belonging to different religious traditions. The extension will help accommodate our Catholics and others for liturgical celebrations, and will serve as a multipurpose hall when needed for pastoral purposes.

From the Deacon's Desk

In addition to the National Eucharistic Pilgrimages and the Eucharistic Congress, our USCCB has been quite busy. They had their Spring Plenary Assembly last month. They discussed many things including: the 2021-2024 Synod on Synodality; the Religious Worker Visa Program; the National Review Board; advancing the cause for beatification and canonization for Adele Brise; three action items related to liturgical texts pertaining to the Liturgy of the Hours; two sets of guidelines to assist with specific ministries ('Listen, Teach, Send: A National Pastoral Framework for Ministries with Youth and Young Adults' and 'Keeping Christ's Promise: A Pastoral Framework for Indigenous Ministry'). The USCCB also issued the National Synthesis of the People of God in the United States of America (National Synthesis). Bishop Flores expressed, "This document reflects the sense that there exists among Catholics in the United States a deep desire to rebuild and strengthen our communion as the Body of Christ." The National Synthesis is a culmination of a nationwide listening process that followed the First Session of the Assembly of the Synod in October 2023 and along with the contributions of episcopal conferences worldwide, will form the basis of the work to be engaged at the Assembly of the Synod in October 2024. 
