### FROM THE PASTOR...

#### Reflection for the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary time—Year B

A Cardinal enters the Pope's residence. "Your Holiness, I have some very good news and some very bad news", he says. "My son, I've had a hard day. Please give me the good news first to cushion the bad news." The Pontiff requests. "Your Holiness, I just received a phone call from Jesus and he has returned to Earth to bring The Kingdom of God!" "Glorious! Glorious!" Shouts the Pope. ""It's finally the day we've waited for millennia! Now what bad news could possibly dampen that good news?" "Well your Holiness, he was calling from Salt Lake City...."

The Gospel this weekend centers on faith and the meaning of the Kingdom of God. Jesus tends to allow the crowd to discern for themselves the meaning and the significance of the gift of the kingdom. Therefore, two parables about the seeds are presented to us in the Gospel reading. The emphasis in the parable of the seed is on the seed as a "capsule of life." As it is, the seed does not only have life within it allows the life to grow at the same time. Thus, Jesus tells the crowd to consider how someone scatters seed which over time sprouts and develops. When the crop is ripe for harvest, the owner wields his sickle at once.

The second parable focuses on the tiny mustard seed. The mustard seed was considered by the first century farmers in Jesus' part of the world as the smallest seed. But as small as the mustard seed is, it develops into a tree and provides a nesting place for birds.

Growth is not an overnight phenomenon. It requires time and nurturing to develop properly. The development of virtues and the love of God is gradual. But when life is rooted in God it flourishes and produces fruit even into old age. So, the reign of God, the kingdom of God begins in very ordinary circumstances, and it matures gradually until it has spread itself far and wide.

Just as the tree welcomes the birds, so is God's kingdom welcoming and open to many.

Today, the Kingdom of God is present in the Church. When we tell people about the love of God and welcome people in our Church, the Kingdom of God is spreading. Although the mystery of the kingdom of God unfolds within human history, we need the eyes of faith to recognize it. Just as the life force that thrust the branches of the mustard seed farther and farther cannot be seen, so also is the kingdom. We observe the reign of the kingdom in the manifestations that we see even when we cannot say how it happens.
