

Reflection on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

A four-year-old was in church when the wine and communion wafers were passed out. He was very interested in this, and started to get up. His mother leaned over and told him that he was not old enough to partake in the Communion. Later, when the collection plate came by, he ignored it. His mother again leaned over and tried to coax the nickel out of him. He steadfastly refused, stating, "If I can't eat, I'm not paying."

This weekend we celebrate the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ or Corpus Christi. This feast has its origin in the visions of Saint Juliana of Liège way back in the 11th century. The feast is intended to make us value and appreciate the presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist and to see him acting in the Church, the body of Christ and transforming the world through the Church. Transubstantiation is the doctrine that teaches that the bread and the wine after the prayer of consecration by the priest at Mass, substantially assume a new spiritual essence—the body and blood of Christ. Like the disciples of Jesus, many people have difficulty understanding this mystery. A new Pew Research Center survey finds that most self-described American Catholics do not believe this core teaching. In fact, nearly seven-in-ten Catholics (69%) say that the eucharist is more of a symbols than the real presence.

However, in John's gospel chapter 6, Jesus teaches about the bread of life by explicitly talking about "eating His flesh" and "drinking His blood. At the last Supper Jesus says, "This is my Body and This is my Blood." Thus, the Eucharist is the unbloody renewal of the sacrifice of Calvary itself. Moreover, Jesus Christ instituted the Eucharist not to perpetuate the Last Supper, but rather the sacrifice of the Cross (Catechism of the Catholic Church #1367).

There are occasions when the accidents of the bread and wine have also changed. Look up Eucharistic miracles on the internet: In Oct. 2006, a parish in the Chilpancingo-Chilapa Diocese of Mexico held a retreat. During mass, two priests and a religious sister were distributing communion when the religious sister looked at the celebrant with tears in her eyes. The Host that she held had begun to effuse a reddish substance. To determine the validity of the event, Bishop Alejo Zavala Castro asked Dr. Ricardo Castañón Gómez (who researched the Eucharistic miracle in Buenos Aires) and his team to conduct scientific research. In 2013, the research concluded that: "The reddish substance analyzed corresponds to blood in which there are hemoglobin and DNA of human origin. . . The blood type is AB, like the one found in the Host of Lanciano and in the Holy Shroud of Turin." The Eucharist is God himself who comes to us in a loving and lowly way. In the Eucharist we reenact the love of God who creates and recreates the world by intervening in the course of history. At mass, the bread and wine become a real presence of Jesus in the community of believers celebrating the Eucharist. Consequently, whenever we eat the bread and drink the wine at the Eucharistic celebration (or brought to people at home or hospital), we receive into ourselves the very life of Christ. Moreover, the Eucharist reminds us that the most sacred thing that we can also do in life is to sacrifice our lives for others. This is to say that there also another important aspect of the Eucharist. The Eucharist is not a bread that can be eaten alone. It is bread broken and shared with the community. Pope Francis highlights this point beautifully in Amoris Laetitia: "We must not forget that "the 'mysticism' of the sacrament has a social character". When those who receive it turn a blind eye to the poor and suffering, or consent to various forms of division, contempt and inequality, the Eucharist is received unworthily."
