

#### **Reflection on the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity**

Little Johnny was passing a church while riding his bike. As he passed, the priest came out and said: Johnny, aren't you coming into Mass. Johnny said, I would, but, I'm afraid someone will steal my bike while I am inside. the priest said: Don't worry, Johnny, The Holy Spirit will watch your bike. Now come in. When Johnny came in, he began to make "The Sign Of The Cross: "In The Name Of the Father, And Of The Son..... Amen. The priest said; Johnny, what about the Holy Spirit...did you forget? No, Father, He is outside watching my bike.

The mystery of the Holy Trinity, which we celebrate this weekend, is a doctrine articulated by the ecumenical council of Nicaea in 325. The belief in the Holy Trinity is one of the fundamental doctrines of Christianity and, more so, the greatest mystery of our Faith, namely, that Three Divine Persons are sharing the same Divine nature in one God. "There is one God, who has three Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Each Person is God, yet there is still only one God" (CCC #234, #253-256). The feast leads us to the understanding of the true nature of God.

Although the term "Trinity" is not found in the Bible, there are specific references to the actions of the Trinitarian God in the New Testament. The great commission: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matt. 28:19); the apostolic greeting formula: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all" (2 Corinthians 13:13) are some indications to the biblical foundation for the doctrine of the Trinity. Thus, the doctrine underlies all major Christian feasts, including Christmas, the Epiphany, Good Friday, Easter, the Ascension, and Pentecost. We are all baptized, absolved of our sins, and anointed in the name of the Blessed Trinity. The history of God's people reveals a God who desires to enter an intimate relationship with his people, a God who comes into their account not just as a transcendent being but always present in the world. We know that God creates because we are part of the mystery of creation. We know that He saves because we have experienced the salvific work of God in Jesus Christ. Our faith in the Trinitarian God is an invitation to experience God in His distinct self-expression. The God of history who has revealed himself to communities and individuals through the ages in different ways continues to act here and now as God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. Jesus teaches about the nature of God in his willingness to forgive us, adopts us, and empowers us with the Holy Spirit. Most of what we know about God's life is what we see in Jesus Christ. In Him, God is Our Father, who art in Heaven. The Trinity then expresses the relationship between the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and by extension, with all adopted sons and daughters of God.


